BREAST CANCER IS THE MOST FREQUENTLY DIAGNOSED CANCER AMONG WOMEN IN AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND. IN 2025 IT'S PREDICTED THAT 20,973 WOMEN AND 221 MEN WILL BE DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER IN AUSTRALIA AND 3,500 WOMEN AND 25 MEN WILL BE DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER IN NEW ZEALAND.






BREAST CANCER IS THE MOST DIAGNOSED CANCER FOR WOMEN AGED 40-59.


APPROXIMATELY 58 PEOPLE ARE DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER EVERY DAY IN AUSTRALIA, AND APPROXIMATELY 9 PEOPLE ARE DIAGNOSED EVERY DAY IN NEW ZEALAND.

WHILE MORE PEOPLE ARE BEING DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER EACH YEAR, WITH IMPROVED SCREENING AND AWARENESS, MORTALITY RATES ARE DECREASING THANKS TO BREAST CANCER RESEARCH.

IN 2025, IT IS ESTIMATED THAT 3,272 WOMEN AND 36 MEN WILL DIE FROM BREAST CANCER IN AUSTRALIA. THAT MEANS **9 AUSTRALIANS DIE FROM BREAST CANCER EVERY DAY.**

IN NEW ZEALAND, APPROXIMATELY 638 WOMEN AND 3 MEN WILL DIE FROM BREAST CANCER.
